RESOURCES AND PROGRAMS

FOR HOMEOWNERS

The Restore Louisiana Homeowner Assistance Program provides critical support to homeowners impacted by Hurricanes Laura, Delta and Ida, and/or the May 2021 Severe Storms to repair or replace their homes, or reimburse them for repairs already completed.

The first step for a homeowner to qualify for assistance is completing a brief survey on any smart phone, computer or tablet at **restore.la.gov**, or by calling the program call center at 866.735.2001 between 8 a.m. – 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

FOR RENTERS

The Louisiana Housing Corporation administers several rental programs offering decent, safe, affordable, community-based housing that provide tenants with the rights of tenancy and connections to voluntary and flexible support and services for people with very low incomes and chronic, disabling health conditions.

FOR LANDLORDS

Rental Restoration and Development Program

The Rental Restoration and Development Program (RRDP) provides assistance to developers of in-fill residential rental housing in declared disaster areas affected by the 2020-21 disaster events (Hurricanes Laura, Delta and Ida and/or May 2021 Severe Storms). The Louisiana Housing Corporation started accepting applications in May 2023 from applicants who will construct new residential rental housing units or renovate residential rental housing units in the specified areas.

Middle -Market Loan Program (MMLP)

The Middle-Market Loan Program is a competitive program that provides assistance for developers to create multifamily rental units that feature certain disaster-resilience characteristics by primarily using conventional financing, CDBG-DR funds and developer equity housing in declared disaster areas affected by the 2020-21 disaster events. Developers may not combine these CDBG-DR funds with Low Income Housing Tax Credits. CDBG-DR funds will be loaned at an interest rate selected by the applicant and will be payable from Surplus Cash based on program terms and conditions and will be fully repaid no later than Year 10.

Prime Program (Piggyback)

The Prime Program (Piggyback) objective is to create multifamily rental units by primarily using LHC Tax-Exempt Bonds, CDBG-DR funds (structured as soft first or second mortgages), and equity from the sale of 4% LIHTCs, allowable in accordance with Section 42(h)(4) of the Code. All developments funded through the program are to primarily benefit low- and moderate-income populations. Awards will not be less than Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) in CDBG-DR gap financing to any individual property housing in declared disaster areas affected by the 2020-21 disaster events.



Rental Affordability Preservation Program

The Rental Affordability Preservation Program will support the improvement, affordability and stability of units that serve LMI renters. This program aims to ensure decent, safe and sanitary housing in good repair for Louisianans regardless of their economic status, and to stem displacement of LMI households from neighborhoods experiencing speculation and rising rents. RAPP will provide gap financing to qualified applicants to support the acquisition and rehabilitation of rental properties that serve residents at 30% to 80% AMI, and which require rehabilitation to meet HUD standards of being decent, safe, sanitary and in good repair. This program will target areas with low concentrations of housing units, and that are undergoing substantial development, experiencing rising rents and speculative acquisitions and other indicators of imminent displacement for LMI residents housing in declared disaster areas affected by the 2020-21 disaster events.

FOR PARISHES AND MUNICIPALITIES: INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAMS

Resilient Communities Infrastructure Program

The Resilient Communities Infrastructure Program will expand and improve resilient community planning through infrastructure projects in impacted areas, working to reduce overall risk to the population and structures from future hazard events while also reducing reliance on federal funding for future disasters. Nonfederal Share Match Program

The Nonfederal Share Match Program provides non-federal match funding for FEMA Public Assistance grants to offset the burden of local match requirements for infrastructure repair and rebuilding projects.

Phase I of this program will be match reimbursements for Category A and B only. The program is currently reviewing submitted projects to determine eligible LMI projects to be selected for global match funding.

The program encourages new economic opportunities in affected communities and supports recovery in established commercial areas. Small Business Loan Program

The Small Business Loan Program helps disaster-affected small businesses and non-profits recover from the designated storms through a loan program for non-construction expenses. The state will provide loans through participating non-profit lenders who will implement and administer the program.
